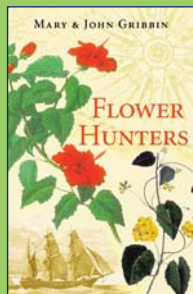

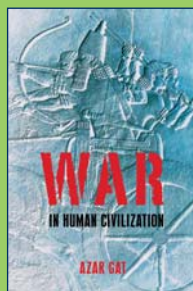
**FLOWER HUNTERS**
