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## The Spirit of the Blitz

PAUL ADDISON and JEREMY A. CRANG

### *The inside story of Home Intelligence during the Blitz*

During the Blitz, the morale of the British people was clandestinely monitored by Home Intelligence, a unit of the Ministry of Information that kept watch on the behaviour and opinions of the public and eavesdropped on their conversations, compiling secret reports on the state of popular morale as the Luftwaffe attacked Britain's major towns and cities between September 1940 and May 1941.

Edited and introduced by two leading historians of the period, the complete and unabridged sequence of reports provide us with a unique and extraordinary window into the mindset of the British during a momentous period in their history. Not only do they include in-depth reports on the effects of the bombing, including special reports on Coventry, Clydebank, Hull, Barrow-in-Furness, Plymouth, Merseyside, and Portsmouth, but also insights into almost every aspect of everyday life in Britain as well as the response of the public to the shifting military fortunes of the war.

Reading like the collective diary of a nation, the reports strip away the nostalgia that has grown up around the period, reminding us instead of the sufferings and sacrifices, the many frustrations and difficulties of daily life, the administrative bungling, the grumbling and petty jealousies, and the determination of the overwhelming majority to put up with it all for the sake of beating Hitler.

Before the Second World War, only about 20% of the population went to secondary school and barely 2% to university; today, everyone goes to secondary school and half of all young people go to university. How did we get here from there? *The Crisis of the Meritocracy* answers this question not by looking to politicians and educational reforms, but to the revolution in attitudes and expectations amongst the post-war British public — the rights guaranteed by the welfare state, the hope of a better life for one's children, widespread upward mobility from manual to non-manual occupations, confidence in the importance of education in a 'learning society' and a 'knowledge economy'.

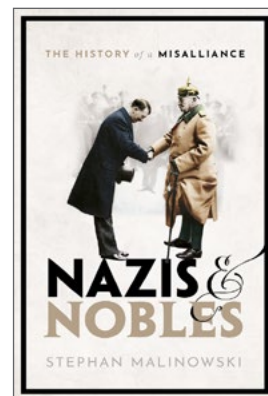

- A new English edition of a best-selling German title, awarded the Hans Rosenberg Prize in 2004
- The only comprehensive study of the complicated relationship between the German aristocracy and the Nazi regime
- Deals with some of the most debated questions of twentieth-century German history

In the mountain of books that have been written about the Third Reich, surprisingly little has been said about the role played by the German nobility in the Nazis' rise to power. While often confidently referred to, the 'fateful' role they played is rarely, if ever, investigated in any real detail. *Nazis and Nobles* now fills this gap, providing the first systematic investigation of the role played by the nobility in German political life between Germany's defeat in the First World War in 1918 and the consolidation of Nazi power in the 1930s.

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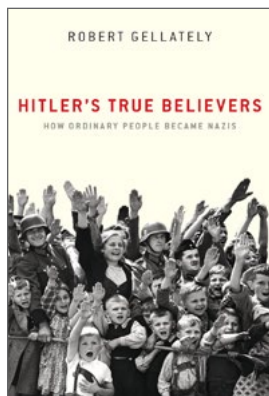
## Hitler's True Believers

How Ordinary People Became Nazis

**ROBERT GELLATELY**, Florida State University

- Rather than dismissing socialism as a disingenuous label Hitler had supposedly chosen for tactical gain, the book argues that we must take the nationalism and socialism seriously
- Based on a wealth of archival documents, primary materials, and secondary sources
- Poses daring new questions on how Germans reacted to Nazi ideology and what the regime had to offer them

Nazi ideology drove Hitler's quest for power in 1933, coloured everything in the Third Reich, and culminated in the Second World War and the Holocaust. In this book, Gellately addresses often-debated questions about how the Führer discovered the ideology and why millions adopted aspects of National Socialism without having laid eyes on the "leader" or reading his work.



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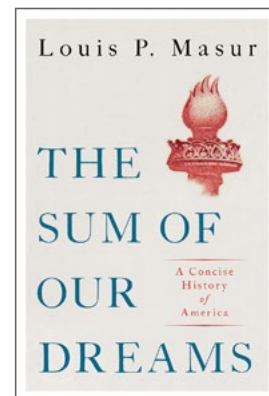
## The Sum of Our Dreams

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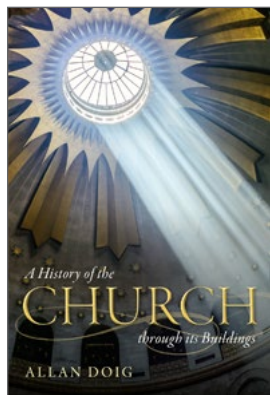


## A History of the Church through its Buildings

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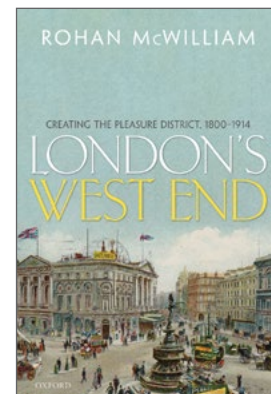
## London's West End

*Grief* presents never-before-seen images and an untold story about a Soviet photographer and his signature image. David Shneer tells the story of how World War II photojournalist Dmitri Baltermants transformed a news photograph of a grieving woman at the first liberation of a German mass atrocity site into a transcendently human tragedy that today appears in Holocaust archives and art museums around the world.



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From the deserts of Sudan to the jungles of Colombia, from the streets of Belfast to the mountains of Kurdistan, paramilitaries have appeared in violent conflicts. Ungör presents a comparative and global overview of paramilitarism, showing how states use it to successfully outsource mass political violence against civilians that transforms and traumatizes societies.



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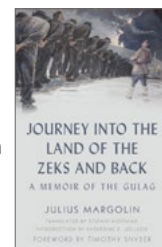

It was one of the earliest published accounts of the Soviet camp system when it was published in France in 1949 and became an established classic in the Russian-speaking world, influential in the formation of the genre of Gulag memoirs.



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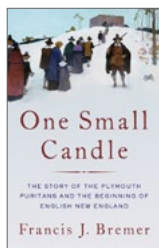
## One Small Candle

This stunning graphic history tells the story of Juan Bautista Tupac Amaru, a descendant of the last Inca rulers. After participating in his half-brother's massive rebellion that stretched across Peru from 1780 to 1783, Juan Bautista spent forty years imprisoned by the Spanish, on an "odyssey" that took him from Cusco to Lima to Rio de Janeiro to Cádiz to Ceuta, the African presidio, and back to South America.

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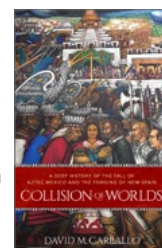
## Collision of Worlds
